CJC Archbishop's Scholarship

Guided by our mission to Build a Generation in Truth and Love, CJC nurtures every student to be a 'Thinker with a Mission and Leader with a Heart'. The CJC Archbishop's Scholarship is given in recognition of a student's strong academic achievement, leadership qualities and service to the community.

With effect from 2018, the CJC Archbishop's Scholarship is available for application by graduating Sec 4/5 students from secondary schools affiliated to CJC. CJC would like to invite students who possess a good academic track record in secondary school with proven leadership qualities and commitment to serve the community to apply for the scholarship. To be considered for the scholarship interview, applicants must:

- Obtain L1R5 (Raw) of 13 points or less with at least a 'B' for Mother Tongue or a Pass in Higher Mother Tongue for the Sec 4/5 Preliminary Examinations; and
- Demonstrate strong leadership qualities and commitment to serve the community through leadership positions held in school and/or involvement in relevant projects.

Selected applicants who meet the above criteria will be invited to attend a scholarship selection interview in November 2019. Shortlisted applicants will be given a conditional offer of the Archbishop's Scholarship by January 2020 (before the release of the GCE 'O' Level results). The scholarship will be confirmed and awarded in February 2020 upon the applicant:

- Obtaining L1R5 (Raw) of 9 points or less, with at least a 'B' for Mother Tongue or a Pass in Higher Mother Tongue, in the GCE 'O' Level Examinations; and
- Applying for and gaining admission to CJC via the Joint Admission Exercise (JAE) in 2020.

Terms of Scholarship

Students who are awarded the Archbishop's Scholarship will receive an award valued at \$2000 per year and can look forward to many different opportunities to further develop their academic and leadership potential in CJC. The scholarship is renewable in the JC2 year subject to continuing good academic performance, demonstration of leadership qualities and service to the community. The Archbishop's scholar may apply for and hold other scholarships for which they are eligible for after admission into CJC, e.g. MOE English Elective Scholarship (ELES).

CJC Archbishop's Scholarship - FAQs

1) What is the advantage of applying for the CJC Archbishop's Scholarship in Sec 4/5?

With effect from 2018, the CJC Archbishop's Scholarship is open to Sec 4/5 students of secondary schools affiliated to CJC. Applying for and securing the scholarship early enables Archbishop's scholars to leverage on the available developmental opportunities at the start of their JC1 year. Students from non-affiliated schools will only apply for the scholarship in the later part of Semester 1 of the JC1 year.

2) What are the developmental opportunities available to CJC Archbishop's Scholars?

Archbishop's scholars can look forward to many exciting opportunities to further develop their academic and leadership potential in CJC. This includes opportunities to be part of the college's signature Ignite Programme, a talent development programme which hones students' critical thinking skills and develops future-oriented leaders. Scholars can also look forward to developmental opportunities such as representing the college at the prestigious annual Pre-University Seminar, participation in local and overseas academic and service learning programmes, and work attachments. In addition, scholars will have opportunities to participate in enrichment programs to further develop and stretch their abilities and talents in respective academic subjects and engage in dialogue sessions with ministers, senior civil servants and distinguished alumni to broaden their perspectives.

3) Will the scholarship be renewed in JC2?

The scholarship will be renewed in the JC2 year if the student achieves a UES rank point of 70 points (excluding Project Work) and passes in all subjects at the JC1 Promotional Examinations, with sustained leadership qualities and commitment to serve the community.

4) What is the period of application?

Sec 4/5 students from secondary schools affiliated to CJC are invited to apply for the Archbishop's Scholarship from 16th September to 4th October 2019.

5) What supporting documents will I need? Can I confirm that these documents have been received?

After submitting the online application form, please email a copy of your Sec 4/5 prelims and mid-year examination results slips to CJCScholarships@moe.edu.sg by 4th October 2019. Other supporting documents e.g. CCA certificates, certificates of awards and achievements and school testimonial should also be attached. You will receive an email indicating receipt of your documents.

6) When will the interviews be conducted?

The selection interviews will be held at CJC in November 2019. We will contact you around mid-November and provide further details if you are selected for the scholarship selection interview.

7) Is the CJC Archbishop's Scholarship open only to Catholic students?

The scholarship is open to all Sec 4/5 students from affiliated schools regardless of religious faith.

8) Which are the secondary schools affiliated to CJC?

Sec 4/5 students from the 15 secondary schools affiliated to CJC can apply for the CJC Archbishop's Scholarship in their graduating year. The affiliated secondary schools are: Assumption English School, Catholic High School, CHIJ Katong Convent, CHIJ Secondary (Toa Payoh), CHIJ St. Nicholas Girls' School, CHIJ St. Theresa's Convent, CHIJ St. Joseph's Convent, Hai Sing Catholic School, Holy Innocents' High School, Maris Stella High School, Montfort Secondary School, St. Anthony's Canossian Secondary School, St. Gabriel's Secondary School, St. Joseph's Institution, St. Patrick's School.
